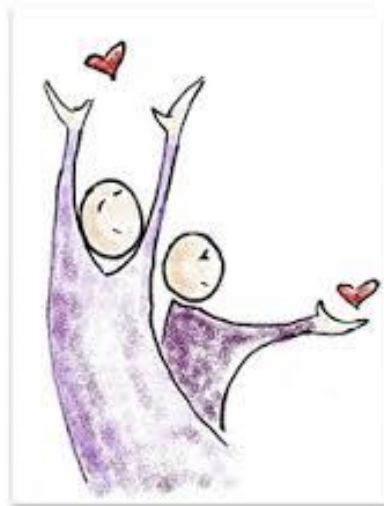




Generosity in Later Life
