Independent Examiner's Report to the Members of

St Pancras Parochial Church Council

This report on the accounts of the St Pancras Parochial Church Council for the year ended 31st December 2016, which are set out on pages 2 to 11 is in respect of an examination carried out in accordance with the Church Accounting Regulations 2006 ("the Regulations") and Section 145 of the Charities Act 2011 ("the Act").

Respective Responsibilities of the Parochial Church Council ("PCC") and the Examiner As Members of the PCC you are responsible for the preparation of the financial statements. You consider that the audit requirements of the Regulations and, of the Act do not apply. It is our responsibility to issue this report on those financial statements in accordance with the terms of the Regulations.

Basis of this Report

Our examination was carried out in accordance with the General Directions given by the Charity Commission under Section 145(5) (b) of the Act and to be found in the Church Guidance, 2006 edition, issued by the Finance Division of the Arcbishops' Council. That examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the PCC and a comparison of the accounts with those records. It also includes considering any unusual items or disclosures in the financial statements and seeking explanations from you as Trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit and consequently we do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.

Independent Examiner's Statement

Notes to the Financial Statements

For the year ended 31st December 2016

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statement has been prepared in accordance with the Church Accounting regulations, together with applicable accounting standards and the Charities Statement of Recommended Practice.

1.1 Historical Cost Convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

1.2 Funds

- a) General funds represent the funds of the Parochial Church Council that are not subject to any restrictions regarding their use and that are available for application for the general purposes of the Parochial Church Council. These include funds set aside for a particular purpose by the Parochial Church Council, including the Mary Thomas Bequest, the Catherine O'Reilly Bequest, and the Lillian Ruff legacy.
- b) The purposes of the restricted funds are shown in note 8.
- c) The accounts include transactions, assets and liabilities for which the Parochial Church Council can be held responsible. They do not include the assets of church groups that owe an affiliation to another body or those that are informal gatherings of church members.

1.3 Incoming Resources

a) Voluntary Income and Capital Sources

- i) Collections are recognised when made.
- ii) Amounts receivable under covenant are recognised only when honoured by the covenantor.
- iii) Income tax recoverable on covenanted or gift aid donations is recognised when received.
- iv) Grants and legacies to the Parochial Church Council are accounted for as soon as the Council is informed of the entitlement and the likely amount due.
- v) Funds raised by activities or by sales are accounted for gross.

b) Other Ordinary Income

- i) Rental income for the letting of Church Premises is accounted for when earned.
- ii) Parochial fees due to the Parochial Church Council for weddings, funerals etc., are accounted for on an event by event basis.

1.4 Application of Resources

a) Grants

Grants and donations are accounted for when paid.

b) Costs directly related to the work of the Church

The Diocesan quota is accounted for when payable and any quota unpaid at 31st December is shown as a creditor in the balance sheet.

1.5 Fixed Assets

a) Consecrated land and buildings and moveable church furnishings

Consecrated and beneficial property is excluded from the accounts by S.96(2) of the Charities Act 1993. As the Church House is on a separate site it does not form part of the consecrated and beneficial property and is therefore included as a tangible asset.

i) No value is placed on moveable church furnishings held by the church wardens in special trust for the Parochial Church Council and which requires a faculty for disposal since the Parochial Church Council considers this to be an inalienable property. All expenditure incurred during the year on consecrated property and moveable church furnishings, whether maintenance or improvement, is written off.

b) Other land and buildings

Other land and buildings (the Church House) held on behalf of the Parochial Church Council for its own purposes are valued at insurance value. No depreciation is charged against such property but any expenditure on maintenance or improvement is written off as incurred.

c) Other fixtures, fittings and office equipment

Equipment used in the church premises is depreciated on a straight line basis over three years. Individual items of equipment with a purchase price of £2,000 or less are written off in the period in which the asset is acquired.

1.6 Current Assets

- a) Amounts owing to the Parochial Church Council at 31st December in respect of fees, rents or other income are shown as debtors less any provision for amounts that may prove uncollectible.
- b) Short term deposits include cash held on deposit either with the Central Board of Finance or at a Bank or Building Society.

9. DETAILS OF FUNDS

The General Funds include:

Mary Thomas Bequest

Mary Beatrice Thomas, a former parishioner, by will dated 1996 left half the residue of her Estate to the Church. The PCC resolved that it be a Designated Fund, the income of which would be available to finance improvements projects to the fabric and facilities of the Church buildings and also offer financial support to artistic and musical ventures. Only in exceptional circumstances may the income be used to support the Church's general expenses. The money is invested in the fixed Interest Securities Fund of the CBF and income paid into a dedicated CBF Deposit Fund account. During 2004 the balance of the Catherine O'Reilly Bequest was added to the Fund. Since then the Miss L. Ruff legacy and some other monies have been added to the Fund.

The Restricted Funds consist of:

Churchwardens' Fund

Income is received from the St Pancras Lands Trust and held by the Churchwardens for the maintenance of the fabric of the church and the performance of the divine worship therein. This money is received by virtue of the provisions of the St Pancras Ecclesiastical Regulation Act 1868 and is now placed in a dedicated CBF Deposit Fund account.

Music Festival Fund

The Parochial Church Council organises an annual music festival. It has been agreed that the funds raised from this festival should be kept as a restricted fund with surplus funds available to support future festivals.

Heritage Lottery Fund - Portico Project (formerly Ron Wilkinson Legacy Fund)

Ron Wilkinson, a parishioner, who died in 2013, left a legacy to assist in the repair of the Church's portico roof. Since then additional donations have been added to this legacy together with a grant from the Heritage Lottery Fund. This has enabled the development stage to be started and this was completed in the Spring of 2015. Since then the delivery stage has been started and was be completed in the Summer of 2016.

Camden Food Bank

Money has been received as contributions to the Camden Food Bank, and certain payments have been made on its behalf. This fund will be closed when the Food Bank has its own bank account.
